#### **EMERGENCY FOOD & CLOTHING SUPPLIES:**

Keep enough supplies in your home to meet your needs for at least three days. <u>Target eventually having a two week supply in your home.</u> Assemble a Disaster Supplies Kit with items you may need in an evacuation. Store these supplies in sturdy, easy-to-carry containers such as backpacks, duffle bags or covered trash containers.

#### Include:

- A three-day supply of water (one gallon per person per day) and food that won't spoil.
- One change of clothing and footwear per person, and one blanket or sleeping bag per person.
- A first aid kit that includes your family's prescription medications.
- Special items for infant, elderly or disabled family members.
- An extra pair of glasses.
- Keep important family documents in a waterproof container. Keep a smaller kit in the trunk of your car.

#### REMEMBER UTILITIES!

Locate the main electric fuse box, water service main and natural gas main. Learn how and when to turn these utilities off. Teach all responsible family members. Keep necessary tools near gas and water shut-off valves.

Remember, turn off the utilities only if you suspect the lines are damaged or if you are instructed to do so. If you turn the gas off, you will need a professional to turn it back on.

#### FINAL SUGGESTIONS AND REMINDERS:

- Store your kit in a convenient place known to all family members. <u>Keep a smaller version of the Disaster</u> <u>Supplies Kit in the trunk of your car</u> with enough food and water for <u>three</u> days.
- Keep items in air-tight plastic bags.
- Change your stored water supply every six months so it stays fresh.
- Rotate your stored food at least once a year...
- Re-think your kit and family needs at least once a year. Replace batteries, update clothes, etc.
- Ask your physician or pharmacist about storing prescription medications.
